

Aurora Borealis Keeps U. S. Radios Disrupted

The aurora borealis continued to disrupt radio communications yesterday. Although not visible in the New York area, the aurora was so brilliant over Europe that it aroused fears of conflagrations.

Monday night an unusually brilliant display and a powerful electromagnetic storm virtually isolated the United States from radio contact with the rest of the world.

R. C. A. Communications, Inc., reported last night that radio signals, with European points, which had been "jumpy" all day, were totally lost about 3 P. M. Contact was maintained with South America. The Mackay Radio and Telegraph Company, Inc., said it had been out of touch with all points since Monday night.

Later last night there were periods during which radio messages could be sent and received.
