

AURORA SEEN ON L. I.

2-Hour Display Observed — Radio Disruption Goes On

An aurora display laced the skies over Long Island with shimmering curtains of color last night in the continuing aftermath of strong sunspot activity.

It was seen in several scattered points between 9 and 11 o'clock. In Massapequa, Theodore Kaplits of 483 Merrick Road, an amateur astronomer, observed the phenomenon during the prolonged display.

The sunspot flares occurred Tuesday and have severely disrupted radio communications across the North Atlantic. R. C. A. Communications said conditions had improved last night but were still "far from ideal." The interference is expected to clear by tomorrow.
